eFlow Summer Camp in New Ross Celtic in August

New Ross Celtic will host the FAI Summer School between August 20th and 24th this year at our grounds in Butlersland, New Ross. The camp will cater for boys and girls aged 6-14 years of all abilities. Each camp runs from Monday to Friday from 10.30am to 3pm.

The camps are designed to cater for all players, regardless of ability. If you're new to the game, you will learn all of the fundamental skills that a budding footballer needs. If you're already experienced, the camps will help you hone your existing talent and introduce you to new tricks and

sessions.

Although every day is different, each camp day follows a similar format: Morning Session: Welcome, warmups and fundamental skills-specific training (i.e. passing, dribbling, shooting, heading)

Lunch Break: All kids should bring a healthy packed lunch with plenty of water! Afternoon: Mini leagues and tournaments

On the first day of each camp, each participant will receive a full set of kit, a football and a backpack - all exclusive to the eFlow FAI Summer Soccer Schools.

### Sean Duffy set for Emerging Talent Assessment

Hot on the heels of his outstanding performances for the Wexford Under 14 team in the Kennedy Cup has come the news that Sean Duffy, one of New Ross Celtic's brightest young stars, has been selected for the National Emerging Talent assessment days on June 27th and July 4th, from which a team to represent Ireland in the Hibernia Trophy will be selected. Sean was a member of the New Ross Celtic under 16 team last year which completed a third season in a row unbeaten in domestic competition, notching up yet another League and Cup double in the process. He was also a member of the under 14 team which claimed second place in the League and were most unfortunate to be edged out at the semi final stage of the Cup by eventual winners Gorey Rangers. Sean's parents, Colm and Liz Duffy, and brothers Ben and Declan, were understandably ecstatic at the news of Sean's call up. Sean's brother, Ben, who also starred for New Ross Celtic at Schoolboy level, was a member of the Wexford Youths team that claimed the F.A.I. Youth Cup this season.

Sean was accompanied on the Wexford Team by Thomas O'Connor, who belied his age to shine as Wexford reached the Kennedy Cup Final for the first time ever before succumbing to a sucker punch at the death as the much hyped D.D.S.L. snatched victory with the last kick of the game. Thomas is eligible to play in the Kennedy Cup again next year. Both players scored vital goals during the campaign while Thomas was denied what would surely have been goal of the tournament by the width of the crossbar in the quarter final win over Kilkenny.

trying to get things level but they were caught on the counter attack and went into the break 3-1 down. The next goal was always going to be important because if Celtic could get it, they would be right back in the game but it didn't go their way when a shot from way out caught the keeper off guard and skidded into the back of the net. At that stage Celtic just felt that there was no coming back, Michael Kelly got one back but Moyne scored again to make it 5-2 with just 10 minutes left. Rory O Connor was brought on for Ger Berry and made a big change chasing down every ball and putting the defenders under a lot of pressure, Ger still an under 10 player is definitely one for the future. But Next came the unthinkable when Thomas O Connor and Sean got a goal a piece and the boys realised this game wasn't over and with the support on the line shouting and cheering gave them an extra boost to go and try win the game. With just injury time Left Sean Duffy made it 5-5 and all you could hear was roars from the sideline to the ref asking him what time was left. One and a half minutes to go and one last attack where everyone pushed forward and the ball fell to Sean Duffy on the 6 yard box who made no mistake to make it 6-5, Unbelievable result when things looked so bad with just 10 minutes remaining. Fair play to all the boys for not giving up. It was a great achievement getting the runners up with the best team by far in Wexford the only team finishing ahead of them.
